

## CALL LANGUAGE FOR NEW FY11 FACULTY SEARCH

**International communication.** The Department of Communication at Georgia State University invites applications for an anticipated tenure-track position in international communication, an appointment requiring a Ph.D. and research program commensurate with doctoral program advisement, pending budget approval. We seek candidates with an active program in media theory and research with transnational or comparative applications and who can teach journalism and advanced seminars in the mass communication curriculum, and whose work examines media practices with special attention to transitioning societies in the Middle East or Asia. Candidates should have the ability to teach in the Department's graduate and undergraduate programs.

International communication is a major area of emphasis in the Department's doctoral program, and the work of area faculty is supported by strong connections to international media and policy organizations, and by the work of its Center for International Media Education. CIME receives major grant support for research and journalism workshop training around the world (and especially in the Middle East and Asia).

Applications should include a letter of application and CV, transcripts, examples of scholarly writing, evidence of teaching effectiveness, and three letters of recommendation. An offer of employment will be conditional upon background verification. Applicant review will begin December 15, 2009.
